Lagan Homes will gift the area set out as allotments to the parish council. The land will be transferred for ± 1.00 the Parish Council will set up a committee to tenant them out etc. The

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Parish Council will take responsibility for enforcement of any rules on them i.e. to keep them tidy and managed etc. Lagan Homes will supply water and electricity to the edge of the allotments and will set up the area initially with top soil so someone can take over them and began to grow produce.

Sir John Peace, chairman of Midlands Connect and Midlands Engine, said: "We sit at the heart of the UK's transport network and therefore an investment in this region's transport will have a remarkable benefit to the whole country and create a positive ripple effect to boost the development of industry, skills and infrastructure.

"This **Strategy** will help to secure the further infrastructure funding needed to lay the groundwork for improved connectivity across the Midlands, bringing the East and West closer together and opening the region's businesses to the world."

The reason you'll hear more is that the western bypass has come high on Midlands connect agenda, and they are working on funding bids because of the link from South Wales to the Midlands and North, but check out their website for more details. Cabinet this month will be passing recommendations on the Adult and Children's Safeguarding boards, this is of huge responsibility because these are the partnerships we as a council so heavily rely upon to ensure that we are ensuring the safety of some of the most vulnerable people in our communities.
